Welcome

If you are **visiting** our church today, we welcome you to our worship service and Christian community. Please find the black registration folder at the end of the pew and help us serve you better by leaving your name and contact information. We promise to keep this information confidential and only use it for personal contact with you and your family. Please join us downstairs for coffee after the service.

We have **Christian education** classes for all ages which meet after the service at 11:00 AM. The “visitor’s card” on the table in the foyer will help you find the meeting place for your child’s class. Join us this evening at 6:00 PM for our evening service of prayer and Bible teaching.

If you are unfamiliar with **our form of worship**, please feel free to speak with one of the Pastors or Elders. We have resources that will help you understand the biblical rationale for why we worship the way we do. Pastor Meyers’s book *The Lord’s Service: The Grace of Covenant Renewal Worship* (Canon Press, 2003) is also available on our book table. The **Lord’s Supper** is observed every Sunday as the climax of covenant renewal worship. We invite to the Lord’s Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and his body, the Church. By eating the bread and wine with us as a visitor, you are acknowledging to the elders of this local church that you are in covenant with God as an active member of a congregation in which the Gospel is faithfully confessed, taught, and believed. You also acknowledge that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for salvation. If you have any doubt about your participation, please speak to one of the elders or the pastor before or after the service. **Note:** The middle circle of cups in each tray contains grape juice, the larger outer ring contains wine. (The grape juice has a darker color than the wine.)

Jesus Christ - Conqueror (Front Cover)



The traditional monograms **IC** and **XC** are ancient Latin abbreviations for **Jesus** (*IHCŌYC*, a Latinized form of his Greek name) and **Christ** (*XRICTOC*). **NIKA** means Victor or Conqueror. Jesus Christ was born to conquer sin, death, and the Devil. The cross in the center of the world reminds us that Jesus has conquered by means of his suffering, death, and resurrection. Jesus now reigns *because* he died for us.

Today our Pulpit and Table paraments are red. This color symbolizes the fiery Spirit, resting on the heads of the Apostles on the day of Pentecost in Acts 2. It is also the color of judgment & martyrdom.

The Lord’s Service Explained

The Call to Worship

Our Lord’s Day begins with the Pastor reading a summons from God’s Word inviting us to draw near to him. Our worship is always a response to God’s gracious summons. When you hear the call to worship you must remember that it is the voice of the Lord himself calling us *through* the Pastor. He is calling us to join him in his house.

In Leviticus chapter 1, when the Lord began his instructions on how the people of Israel were to approach him in worship, we read that he “called Moses and spoke to him from the tent of meeting” (Lev. 1:1). The Lord was in his “house” and called Moses to come to the doorway and hear how he and all the people of Israel might “draw near” to him. It’s all about an invitation into the Lord’s house. The whole “sacrificial system” is God’s way of qualifying his people for fellowship with him in his home.

The words translated as “offering” and “bring an offering” really have nothing to do with “offering” God something. The Hebrew verb and noun used here have to do with “drawing near.” There are things that are indeed “offered” as “tribute” within the sacrificial system. But the word most often mis-translated as “offering” really means “that which is brought near.” So all of what we call the “sacrifices” are properly, if somewhat awkwardly designated “near bringings.” The point is not what we might give or offer to God, but rather how God provides a way for his people to come near to him, to enter into his house to commune with him. The worshipper is able to draw near “in the animal.” What happens to the animal happens to him spiritually.

With us, of course, we no longer approach God by means of animal sacrifices. Jesus Christ, the Lamb of God, has fulfilled this sacrificial pathway into God’s presence. He has died, rose from the dead, and ascended into heaven. Now “in Christ” we have access to God’s heavenly throne and festal Table. When God calls us to draw near to him at the beginning of the worship service we should “with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need” (Heb. 4:16).

A Prayer of Preparation: Almighty God, who throughout the ages has graciously invited your people to draw near and commune with you, grant we pray, that as we hear your life-giving voice we may respond with eager expectation to your summons to enter your house and feast with you; we ask this through Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
