December

Dear Parents,

This quarter marks the close of our cycle of Scripture and catechism memory for the children's Sunday school classes. The memory program is suspended for the summer months. Therefore, you'll notice that this booklet takes on a little different form than in previous quarters.

Recitation for March will continue as usual, and the children will recite their work on the first Sunday of April. The theme for March is the book of Proverbs.

As in previous years, the students will review and recite memory work from the entire school year as a culminating activity. To make the load manageable, we will require the students to recite only the Bible verses, not the catechism answers. Beginning in April, use this booklet as a guide for your child's Bible verse review. Recitation of the first half of the Bible verses will take place on May 7, with the remainder to be recited on May 14. (While the catechism memory portion of the program is not included in the year-end recitation, individual families are encouraged to conduct their own review of this material at home. If you need a list of catechisms for your child, please ask his teacher or check www.prpc-stl.org and click on Children's Sunday School.)

Our annual promotion program will be during the Sunday school hour in June. At that time, students promoted into new classes will be recognized. In addition, all students who have given a good recitation will receive their awards.

The level of parent involvement has been evident in the good work the children have accomplished during this school year. Keep it up, parents! Your labors of love will reap a harvest for eternity.
